

A STRENGTHENED MOVEMENT



With the presence of the 120 member states of the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM), on October 25 and 26, the XVIII Summit of Heads of State and Government was held at the Baku Convention Center, capital of the Republic of Azerbaijan, whose government receives the pro tempore presidency of the agency.

The multilateral event began with the words of the President of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, Nicolás Maduro Moros, who has been the pro tempore presidency of the multilateral organization since 2016. The Venezuelan dignitary presented a report on the management of Venezuela at the head of the forum international, primarily aimed at strengthening cohesion between member states based on solidarity, understanding and mutual respect.

The Venezuelan President said that respect for international law is key to guarantee effective and concerted actions to situations that threaten the welfare of the member states. He stressed that under the protection of multilateralism it is possible to face the aggressions of legal and economic the war against sovereign nations, as well as to provide concrete responses to phenomena such as climate change, the proliferation of racism, crimes of terrorism and military financing.

The Venezuelan leader thanked the support of the member states for the candidacy of Venezuela to the UN Human Rights Council, after capitalizing 105 votes in the October 14 elections.

"Thank you all for this victory of the truth of Venezuela in the face of so much infamy and such a lie. It was a historic triumph amid serious aggressions and imperial blackmail against governments of the world. Our struggle is the struggle of millions, our rebellion against the powerful, the old colonial powers and empires are the rebellion of the peoples of humanity who refuse to submit to the designs of hegemony".

IRRESTRICT SUPPORT TO VENEZUELA



The XVIII Summit of the Non-Aligned Movement concluded last October 26 with unconditional support to President Nicolás Maduro and the resounding rejection of unilateral coercive sanctions led by the administration of Donald Trump. Congratulatory expressions were highlighted for the delivery to Azerbaijan of a strengthened NAM.

During their interventions in the plenary, various members spoke against the multiform war applied by US imperialism in Venezuela, which has been aimed at undermining the quality of life of the people and trying to break their sovereignty.

The president of Cuba, Miguel Díaz-Canel, denounced the resurgence of coercive actions, the constant attacks to the country and described as perverse the attempts to generate a violent escalation to unleash an internal conflict. He urged the 120 countries of the Movement to support Cuba and Venezuela to prevent repeated scenarios such as those in Syria, Iraq, and Libya.

The Minister of Foreign Affairs of Nicaragua Denis Moncada Colindres, sympathized with the peoples and governments of Venezuela and Cuba highlighting their struggles for their sovereignty and self-determination. He urged the international community to respect the independence of the States and stressed that in the world there should no longer be room for destabilizing plans and coups against our legitimate governments.

- The Pan-African Parliament applauded the union of the Venezuelan people in the face of pressure from external powers.
- Tanzania demanded from the States greater commitment in the fight against the eradication of colonialism.
- Iran called on nations to act against the insecurity of cyberspace, the illegitimate use of social networks and data for the influence of public opinion, an operation that qualified as a threat from the current world, in accordance with the maneuver used against Venezuela, last March, which left the country without electricity service for more than seven days.



RESPECT FOR THE UN HUMAN RIGHTS CHARTER



MULTILATERALISM AND RESPECT FOR SOVEREIGNTY

Defense of a multipolar world, respect for the self-determination of peoples and rejection of unilateral measures were the main issues addressed at the XVIII Summit of the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) held between October 25 and 26 in Baku, Azerbaijan.

The members of the NAM reaffirmed their commitment to the principles of the movement and agreed on joint coordination based on the principles of international law and justice to promote stability, peace and global prosperity. The 120 nations agree that the current economic challenges demand urgent and block responses from the international community.

They rejected any action that violates the Charter of the United Nations and human rights as the unilateral measures that block the economic activities of any sovereign nation. NAM Will continue to promote Seeing the fight against xenophobia, terrorism, and in favor of the eradication of poverty and the exaltation of sustainable development and climate change.

NAM SUPPORTS ELECTORAL RESULTS IN BOLIVIA

NAM leaders highlighted the democratic spirit of the Bolivian people who attended the elections peacefully and civilly. They also congratulated the current president of Bolivia, Evo Morales, for his victory in the recent presidential elections held in that South American country, and called for respecting the election result.

According to the Supreme Electoral Tribunal of Bolivia (TSE), with 99.99% of the minutes verified, the candidate of the Movement To Socialism (MAS), Evo Morales, won 47.07% of the votes, while Carlos Mesa, from the Conservative Community Community party, obtained 36.51% of the votes.








VENEZUELA: THE AGGRESSION THAT IS NOT NEWS

VENEZUELA, LEADING WORLD RANKING OF OIL RESERVES



In Europe they seem not to worry about the inhuman consequences of the unilateral coercive measures imposed by the Trump Administration against Venezuelan society.

In the European media many are the headlines, information, myths and legends about Venezuela. In almost all cases, there seems to be a very clear editorial order: every day something has to be said about Venezuela, about Nicolás Maduro. In the most conservative media, in addition, the order is to be merciless, no matter how far the information from the truth is, its origins, sources, or verifications of rigor do not matter. And there, the most devious weapons are the nouns and adjectives that turn themselves into the only version they want to offer their users: dictatorship, tyranny, drug traffickers, posters, corruption, suffering, undemocratic, indolent, mafia, murderers, communists, and so on.

Little, or nothing, is said in European media about the root of political and economic turbulence in Venezuela: the obvious historical struggle between the Venezuelan bourgeoisie, subject to Washington's interests to retake the power of the largest oil reserves on the planet, versus the Bolivarian revolution, which for 20 years has been dedicated to reinvesting the wealth of the country's energy industry in the

most felt needs of the majority and not in the pockets of the old plutocracy.

In Europe they seem not to worry about the inhuman consequences of the unilateral coercive measures imposed by the Trump Administration against Venezuelan society. Erroneous and often known as "sanctions," these illegal measures have led to the most grotesque violation of human rights, with a direct impact on 30 million people. Its objective, to prevent or hinder the State, the main economic force redistributing income in the country, from making use of the international financial system to provide Venezuelans with food, medicine, basic products, to guarantee the correct maintenance of the public services infrastructure and private. This unprecedented aggression with the label of international economic terrorism, severely impacts the productive capacities of the country, especially attacks the oil industry, the main source of national income and intends to collapse the economy as a whole.

From Washington they have openly confessed that "their sanctions" are aimed at subjecting the people to the most cruel circumstances, so that their interventionist will to change the regime is fulfilled. Nor is it common to read in

media and corporate networks in Europe that it has been a sector of the Venezuelan opposition, acting as a fifth column and at the service of the US Government, which has activated all illegal and even criminal routes: political violence, attempt to continued coup d'etat, paramilitary violence, assassination attempts, delivery of assets of the Republic abroad, self-proclaimed parallel government, request for sanctions and international lobby to guarantee the effectiveness of the aggression against its own people. These opposition leaders tend to receive solidary media treatment as well-known and victimized fighters for democracy and freedom in Venezuela. Things you will see, dear Sancho ...


Necessary questions then arise: Are European citizens impartially informed about Venezuela? Does it matter that patients with chronic diseases, in which the time factor is decisive, cannot be treated in a timely manner because of the financial blockade? Does it mean anything to those media that the genocidal measures or sanctions of the United States are aimed at companies that provide food to Venezuela? Can it be news that the infrastructure of public and hospital services is affected by the refusal of the companies' headquarters to supply parts, or to comply with maintenance protocols? Could it have a media impact that despite all the multiform aggression, the Venezuelan State has not privatized health, education, has not closed schools, universities, has not stopped delivering homes, granting pensions to grandparents and has renewed and technified its robust social policy system? Perhaps the theft of 30,000 million euros in money, gold and assets of the Venezuelan State may be the front page headlines. A good part of these resources, by the way, are blocked in European banks.

Do they know in Europe about the hundreds of calls and efforts of President Maduro for the good health of the national dialogue in Europe, despite the attacks and personalized campaigns against him and his family? Was it news in 2017 that the election of the National Constituent Assembly managed to stop the political violence which was unleashed and financed by the United States for months? That is, the "dictator" neutralized the violence, with democracy and the people accompanied him in that challenge. Is there sincere interest in the well-being of the more than 2 million Europeans and their descendants living and working in Venezuela? Has the relationship between the economic migration of Venezuelans and the sanctions been highlighted? We have never read that they refer in European news agencies or press that, in a high gesture of peace diplomacy and dialogue, President Maduro has accepted and promoted the permanence in Venezuela of high level diplomats representing Governments of the European Union who in February did not recognise him as Head of State and government.

It is a truth about the size of a cathedral that inhuman aggression against the Venezuelan economy creates difficulties, suffering and even death. There are already several independent studies that confirm this. From the United Nations Human Rights Council, both its High Commissioner and the Special Rapporteur on the impact of unilateral coercive measures have expressed concern about the devastating consequences of this US policy on the enjoyment and guarantee of human rights. Donald Trump's threats with the use of military force against Venezuela or the reactivation of ancient regional military treaties to attack the country are barely mentioned by the media in Europe.

We Venezuelans and want peace, political, economic stability and respect for our internal affairs. The success of the ongoing dialogue processes will be achieved to the extent that the economic, political and informative aggression ceases, as well as the direct interference of some governments in matters exclusive to the Venezuelan people. The Bolivarian Government will move forward, governing with the people and respecting the Constitution. To dismantle the media fence that looms over Venezuela it is also necessary that all voices be heard.
