Position of the National Dialogue Table before the Communiqué of the International Contact Group of the European Union

The National Dialogue Table rejects the content and terms of the Communiqué issued by the International Contact Group (GIC) of the European Union for contradictory, when it refers to a departure between Venezuelans and disqualifies the efforts and results of our Negotiating Table, questioning its representativeness despite being composed of representatives of various political forces of the opposition and the government of Venezuela.

No one on behalf of the GIC has, so far, been interested in the work, objectives and achievements achieved by the National Dialogue Board, such as the granting of substitute measures for deprivation of liberty to 29 people, including the First Vice President of the National Assembly and the beginning of the designation of a new National Electoral Council within the National Assembly and the return of the parliamentary group of the United Socialist Party of Venezuela, among others.

Ignorance and absolute disinterest often generates serious errors of appreciation and disrespect for Venezuelans. From a distance, it is very easy to disqualify the arduous work of building a dialogue and that of coexistence in order to seek a democratic, electoral way out of real solutions to the people of Venezuela.

The members of the National Dialogue Table are willing to share information with the International Contact Group of the European Union, so that they have a less committed and more objective vision about the development of the dialogues and the situation that Venezuelans live .

HUMANITARIAN TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PLAN REVIEW

On Tuesday, November 4, Jorge Arreaza, Minister of People Power of Foreign Affairs of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, met with the Assistant Secretary General of the United Nations Office for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator, Mark Lowcock, to inspect the humanitarian technical assistance plan that is executed between the Organization and the Bolivarian Government.

Mark Lowcock met with various political actors in the nation, representatives of non-governmental organizations and the diplomatic community to learn about the humanitarian situation and the operation of the multilateral agencies operating in the country.

In September, During the 74th session of the UN General Assembly, held in New York, United States (USA), the Venezuelan Foreign Minister held a meeting with the Deputy Secretary where he ratified the will of the National Executive to maintain the path of dialogue to consolidate the peace of the Latin American country.



COOPERATION AGREEMENTS WITH INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS



The Minister of the People Power of Water Attention, Evelyn Vásquez representing the Venezuelan State and Leticia Courtois, representative of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), signed an Agreement on Inter-institutional Cooperation which consists of a series of broad and non-restrictive joint activities.

It provides for the creation of a Technical Coordinating Commission, with representation from each party, which will hold periodic follow-up meetings to assess compliance and its impacts. Each work plan that is agreed between the parties may be added to the Agreement, as a collaboration activity is identified, which will be detailed taking into account the available resources.

Relations between the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela and the ICRC have been oriented towards reciprocal assistance in solving problems in humanitarian matters, through the promotion of instruments that regulate humanitarian principles between the population and the national security forces. , the promotion of community work towards families affected by violence, induction of primary medical care, first aid, accident prevention, among others.

Last October, the president of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), Peter Maurer held a bilateral meeting with President Nicolás Maduro. Similarly, in April 2019, Maurer visited Venezuela and held meetings with holders of the ministerial portfolios of health, prison services, interior, justice and peace, defense and foreign relations, to discuss humanitarian issues in health and migration .

This international body has had a permanent presence in the country since the agreement signed in 2000, by the commander and leader of the Bolivarian Revolution, Hugo Chávez.

LATIN AMERICA AGAINST NEOLIBERALISM



The Third Anti-Imperialist Congress against Neoliberalism ended last Sunday, November 3 in Havana, Cuba. The event highlighted global solidarity with the Cuban Revolution in the face of intensification of the illegal economic, financial and commercial blockade imposed by the United States (USA).

"Times of hope open, unity is a duty, mobilization a shout of order, popular organization an imminent task and integration a strategy that will lead us to victory ... we commit ourselves to make solidarity with Cuba, mobilizing ourselves in permanent, continuous and systematic actions against the aggressive escalation of the imperialist", indicates the final declaration of the Congress.

The ceremony closing was attended by the first Secretary of the Communist Party of Cuba, Raúl Castro; the President of the Councils of State and Ministers of the Republic, Miguel Díaz-Canel; the President of the National Assembly of Popular Power, Esteban Lasso hernández; the Venezuelan Head of State, Nicolás Maduro, as well as the Executive Secretary of the Sao Paulo Forum, Mónica Valente.

Among the pillar points, the requirement for the illegal blockade to be lifted stands out; the defense of the validity of Latin America and the Caribbean as territory of peace; the denunciation of attempts to activate the Inter-American Treaty of Reciprocal Assistance (TIAR), solidarity with the Bolivarian Revolution and its legitimate president Nicolás Maduro, the release of the former president of Bra-

zil Lula Da Silva, victim of the judicialization of the policy against leftist and progressive leaders, support for the electoral process in Bolivia and the triumph of President Evo Morales.

The document highlights the popular uprising of the Chilean people against neoliberal measures, the defense of the Argentine Falklands, guarantees for the life of all Colombian ex-combatants under the Peace Agreement. Likewise, the fascist attitude of the Brazilian president, Jair Bolsonaro, is repudiated, as well as the demand to the Colombian Government for the integral implementation of the agreements with the FARC and the resumption of the peace dialogue

"We defend the original peoples in their culture, customs and their struggle for their demands; we recognize the prominence and commitment of struggle of young people following the emancipatory legacy of our heroes; We condemn the current anti-migrant policy of the US Government. and the European Union", concludes the document.

THE INSURGENT FILM IN THE BOLIVARIAN REVOLUTION

In recent days, the Venezuelan Film Week in Cuba took place, a new testimony of the strong bonds of union between the two brothers. The meeting, held in Havana, also offers us the opportunity to assess, in all perspective of the fundamental contribution of the Bolivarian Revolution to cultural events, particularly to cinematographic art as an instrument of liberation and training.

“The revolution, is a deep cultural fact, or it is not,” Commandant Chavez permanently proclaimed; an expression that goes back to the dawn of the project of great transformations, in the heat of the National Constituent Assembly (ANC) of 1999, when We began to give the battles to collectively build, together with the People, a Constitution that would be oriented to the defense of our culture and the cultists, including the creators and creators of the cinema, to the creation of a solid platform for the integral development of the audiovisual arts. Cinema and television, since then, had a preponderant place in the life of the society, as instruments for the formation, liberation, and recovery of historical memory and forging the awareness of the social duty of the People.

It must be remembered that the Bolivarian Revolution meant in fact the insurgency of a new cinema in Venezuela, which combine’s fiction and history, has allowed the incorporation of the debate about what we were, what we are and what we want to be as protagonists of our destiny It is the way to continue marching towards the construction of the Socialist Homeland, towards the point of no return of our revolution, by the hand of popular culture.

In times of puntofijista democracy, although we must highlight the great effort and work of many filmmakers, films were made almost entirely with private resources, because for the delivery and pro-Yankee governments in turn, art was a matter of elites But not only that: intimidation, persecution and censorship were common practices, even when “parents of democracy” proclaimed themselves.

In 1976, in my time as a student at the University of the Andes (ULA), I wrote an article that I still have: “The conciliatory cinema and fascism.” He was very young, 23 years old, but he had been observing how, in the first place, some filmmakers tried to misrepresent, through cinema, the history of the armed struggle in Venezuela. Using false elements such as the generalization of betrayal, the absence of principles, lack of organization, defeatism, conformism, and conciliation with the bourgeois system, pre-

sentated a story quite far from reality. On the other hand, bipartisan governments tried to prohibit, in the audiovisual media, the contents related to that struggle of the 60s and 70s of the last century, in a clear practice of fascism disguised as democracy. So, far from promoting the free development of cinema, the State became a hindrance for filmmakers.

The process of national liberation, interpreting the Patriotic and our American history, and in the search for the construction of a new cultural hegemony, allowed with concrete facts to open the doors wide to the creators and creators of the audiovisual arts, without dogmas No ties. This is how a legal instrument, the Cinema Law, was created for the protection and promotion of our cinematography; and that is how the Villa del Cine, the first and only producer of the Venezuelan State, was born in the course of this revolution, which always understood the importance of cinema for the formation of values and the recovery of our historical memory. Today he has thirteen years of life, thirteen years of hard work to unleash the dream of our country.

It is true that in the matter of Cultural Revolution, there is much work to be done and many goals to accomplish. But we continue advancing, in spite of the great difficulties that the nation is going through, as a result of the multifactorial war unleashed from the centers of imperialist power; We continue to fight fiercely against the media-psychological war that seeks to dominate the minds and hearts of Venezuelan people’s.

Amid a criminal economic blockade, the Bolivarian Government continues to promote cultural and artistic development. And it is through art, the creative expression of the Peoples, become’s an instrument for their liberation and the forging tool of their destiny. And also, as Comandante Chávez said, a tool to strengthen ties of brotherhood, solidarity and mutual recognition, ties that one day will concur in the unity of the Peoples, in a world without empires and domination of consciences.
