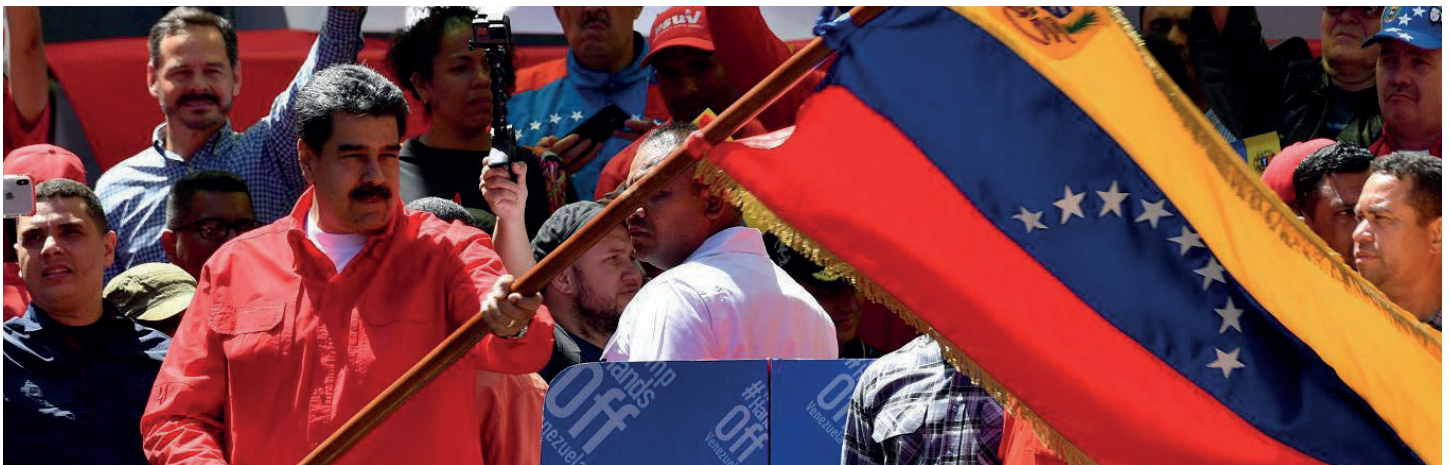




VENEZUELA WILL NOT STOP



In Malabo, the capital of Equatorial Guinea (one of the main promoter countries of the ASA), Bolivarian Venezuela participated a few days ago in the V Summit of Heads of State and Government of the Forum of Gas Exporting Countries (GECF), conducted by the Minister of People Power for Oil, Manuel Quevedo as the representative of the Bolivarian Government under the primiership of Nicolás Maduro Moros.

In this act, we continue to draw up the strategic and cooperative route, which President Hugo Chávez conceived, among other goals, when creating and strengthening the relationship of the South-South Countries, especially in terms of exchange, in this case, gas, to advance the creation of the multipolar world, based on anti-hegemonic policies, and lay the foundations of sustainable development in the energy field and expand cooperative frameworks, comprehensive knowledge and other vital aspects for the sovereignty of our countries. Gas exporting countries, such as Equatorial Guinea, constitute, in this V Summit, an extraordinary projection of sovereignty, at a time when US imperialism accentuates its interventionist will to seize the planet's natural resources, just as the British empire did in Africa in the previous century.

From the Homeland Plan

The joint declaration signed in Guinea by more than sixty countries that export gas reserves worldwide identifies a Chavista dream: empowering peoples to develop their des-

tiny; Latin America and the Caribbean, also China, Vietnam and Syria.

This V summit held in Malabo receives a greater strategic encouragement to strengthen the gas potentiality, based on the principles of complementarity, to diversify and extend it to a set of non-metallic minerals for the development of the South-South.

With these alliances, the government of Nicolás Maduro, having as its epicenter its territory under an asymmetrical and ruthless war, advances in the necessary deconstruction of secular hegemony that the American governments, based on the Monroe Doctrine, intend to overwhelm the world they consider their property.

NATURAL GAS: ENERGY FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



In Malabo, capital of Equatorial Guinea, on November 29 The V Summit of Heads of State and Government of the Forum of Gas Exporting Countries (GECF) was held, with the participation of the Minister of People Power for Oil, Manuel Quevedo, by the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela.

During the installation ceremony of the President of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea, Teodoro Obiang Nguema, offered opening remarks to the Heads of State, Vice Presidents and Ministers of the nations that make up the Forum of Gas Exporting Countries. He also called on the members of the forum to continue working together to guarantee the economic growth and sustainability, economic and social advancement of the nations.

The V Summit reaffirmed the sovereign rights of the nations that integrate it over their natural gas resources and reaffirmed the commitment of the countries of the Forum in the timely and reliable supply of this energy source to contribute to the strengthening of sustainable development plans. Members also strengthened their ties of solidarity and cooperation to boost research development, information exchange, and knowledge transfer, as well as sharing the best practices of the gas industry.

Through a joint declaration, which will govern the operation of this organization for the next two years, its members reaffirmed their role as safe producers, to meet the growing global energy needs, by giving the importance of fair value to ensure sufficient investments throughout the entire value chain.

For the first time the African continent receives this meeting that brings together the main producers, whose members own 64 percent of the world's proven gas reserves, who will sign the Malabo Declaration.

This event is organized every two years and provides an important space to discuss, at the highest level, the global state of the Natural Gas market and adopt joint strategies to maximize the use of this natural resource to boost the development of countries for the benefit of the people.

To date, four presidential summits have been held: The first Gas Summit of Heads of State and Government was held in Doha, Qatar, on November 15, 2011; the second in Moscow, Russia in 2013; the third in Tehran, Iran, in November 2015. and the most recent in Santa Cruz de la Sierra, Bolivia, in 2017.

UNESCO: NEW BOLIVARIAN VICTORY



Within the framework of the 40th General Conference Executive Council of the Organization of Nations United for Education, Science, and Culture (UNESCO), Held in Paris, France, on Friday, November 29, during the first session, Venezuela was elected to hold the Presidency of the Committee on Foreign Relations for the next two years.

During the high-level event, the 58 members that make up the organization voted as follows: Venezuela (31) votes, Argentina (23) votes and (04) abstentions. This, after an intense negotiation process, since the commission is one of the most important and substantive within the United Nations.



Regeneration, the role of youth in creating a world peace agenda was the main theme of this year's General Conference.

VENEZUELA AND FAO: FOOD COMMITMENT

On Friday, November 29, at the headquarters of the Ministry of Popular People for Foreign Affairs of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, representatives of the Bolivarian Government together with Rolf Hackbart, representative of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), signed a letter of intent to expedite the execution of the project called: "Increase in agricultural production, food and nutritional sovereignty and security, with a resilience approach in vulnerable rural communities in Venezuela."



The project that involves financing for 3.6 million dollars seeks to support: The strengthening of the National Information System, the increase of technical and institutional capacities for the development of productive systems and agricultural production with a resilience approach in communities of the states: Lara, Trujillo, Portuguesa and Merida.

VENEZUELA STRENGTHENS DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH CAMBODIA AND MYANMAR



Venezuela and the Kingdom of Cambodia signed memorandum of understanding for the establishment of bilateral consultations

Last Saturday, November 30, during his visit to the Kingdom of Cambodia, the Vice Minister for Asia, the Middle East and Oceania, Rubén Darío Molina, held an important working meeting with the Deputy Minister of the Prime Minister and Permanent Secretary of State of the Ministry of Relations Foreign of this country, Ouch Borith.

During the bilateral meeting, both diplomatic authorities signed a memorandum of understanding that will allow further discussion and agreements on bilateral issues.

With the signing of this memorandum of understanding, bilateral cooperation ties are projected in political, economic, commercial, scientific, technical and cultural matters between Venezuela and the Kingdom of Cambodia.

Finally, Vice Minister Rubén Darío Molina and Vice Minister Ouch Borith expressed their desire to continue contributing to the strengthening of the brotherhood between the two nations.

Republic of the Union of Myanmar

At the end of his visit to the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, Rubén Darío Molina, Vice Minister for Asia, the Middle East and Oceania of the Ministry of Popular People for Foreign Affairs, met on Wednesday with different authorities of the government of this nation, strengthening the Bolivarian

Peace Diplomacy and diversifying relations with the members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (Asean).

In the meeting with Khin Zaw, permanent secretary of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation, the Venezuelan diplomat addressed the establishment of cooperation and mutual assistance in food production, under the principles of food security and sovereignty of both peoples.

He also spoke with the Vice Minister of Electricity and Energy, Tun Naing, and planned to make mutual visits, after reaching the respective agreements with the signing of the Integral Cooperation framework.

Another working meeting was held with Ye Myint Swe, Vice Minister of Natural Resources and Environmental Protection of Myanmar, who discussed the issues inherent in this area linked in Venezuela with the fifth Historic Objective of the Homeland Plan Law, about the preservation of life on the planet.
