KUCHINATE

It is an association of refugee women who have requested political asylum here in Israel. In this association, they receive psychological, health, spiritual assistance, professional training and economic assistance.

The women who come to see us are women in difficulty of all kinds, from different countries, languages and religions. Orthodox Christians and Catholics, as well as Muslims. Some of them are part of the management group and some just work here.

We also have Hebrew Israeli staff. Among the many volunteers, we have people of all faiths, languages and countries. We celebrate all holidays here! When it's a holiday for one of us, it's a holiday for everyone else!

When we enter the center of our association, we all feel at home. For me, it's almost a miracle what I see and breathe there day in and day out, knowing what life is like outside the center in that part of the world.

When I see our Israeli sisters with our other sisters, considered as refugees, sharing, eating, working and praying with them, my heart is moved and I see the Kingdom of God present. An Israeli, who is a social worker, goes almost every day to pick up and carry one of our women who has polio and moves around with great difficulty. Today, this lady was telling me that next Monday, she will come with a group of women to get to know this reality better.

These women are: his mother, his aunts, his sisters and his cousins! She said to me: I also need them to know this reality and to be able to start helping everyone according to their possibilities.

Most of them receive a monthly salary which is not a help. It is the fruit of the work of each of them.

There is a lot of collaboration and mutual aid between them. A fortnight ago, an Israeli doctor called our sister Azezet to tell her that he had operated on a Sudanese child and that since he and his mother arrived at the hospital, no one had come to visit them. He asked her if she could come see them so they wouldn't feel so alone.

She called Rebecca, Paul's mother, and a few days later we went to see them at the hospital. Mr. Azezet shared the news with the other Sudanese women in Kuchinate and a support group was formed. In this center, DIVERSITY is WEALTH and the OTHER is my sister.

Poet, essayist and pedagogue, born in Montreal, Claudine Bertrand has published an important work coupled with a strong editorial activity. She has led collectives. She is one of the most active voices of her generation, she organizes cultural events, she hosts a weekly literary program Arts and Letters at RVM since 2007.

A pioneer, she founded the journal Arcade devoted to women's writing and directed it for 25 years, thus working to make literature known, to disseminate it and to make it visible to different audiences, thus contributing to enriching the francophone culture. A committed woman, marked by feminist and humanist thought, she is considered one of the ambassadors of poetry abroad.

His traveling writing takes us to several continents, seeking to anchor himself in a luminous universe. Ambassador of Quebec poetry, (Switzerland, 1996; Czech Republic, 1998; France, Rhône-Alpes; 2000/2005), La Rochelle 2008; Benin, 2009 and 2010; Senegal, 2010; Algeria, 2011; Cameroon, 2012) it offers many readings, conferences and creative workshops. Frequently solicited by international invitations and translated into several languages, Claudine Bertrand is a leading figure in contemporary poetry.

MAINTAINING THE SPIRIT OF THE OLYMPIC TRUCE THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

“During the Olympics, people have the opportunity to sit together and talk. People forget their differences and forge friendships. There is no distinction between nationality, religion or skin color among athletes.

These are the words of Chinese sailor and champion for peace, the late Guo Chuan. died in 2016, who made a transatlantic crossing to maintain the Olympic truce of the Rio 2016 Games. More than five years later, the Beijing 2022 Olympic and Paralympics Games are just around the corner. 173 Member States of the United Nations (UN) co-sponsored the resolution entitled “Building a peaceful and better world through sport and the Olympic ideal” during the 76th session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) in New York “Actions speak louder than words,” the saying goes, but we believe actions and words are essential to driving lasting change.

In order to achieve the United Nations 2030 Agenda, inclusive public policies ensure actions and words are relevant, and programs on the ground cannot thrive without global international recognition of sport as a critical enabler. Peace and Sport welcomes this UN resolution, which recommends that Member States implement sports-based programs to encourage peace and conflict resolution.

Beyond the Olympic Games, peace through sport is built daily by committed and inspiring players. The 2021 Peace and Sport Awards highlighted 11 initiatives that contribute to a peaceful and better world through sport. We invite you to watch these remarkable change makers, whether government or non-profit, using team and individual sports. Every day, these stakeholders are spreading the global spirit underscored by the adoption of the 2022 truce resolution.

Reports on the promotion of benevolence as a path towards a Culture of Peace.

Today was the day I had to go out to resolve some outstanding issues and on occasion I gave out 126 origami hearts for peace. Of course, wearing a mask and following pandemic protocol. I went to swimming class and my friend wasn't there.

So I left a bundle of hearts for the owner of the space. Then I went to the center of Igarassu and the second stop was with Father Josivan, currently Episcopal Vicar, I presented him with a pot of hearts with 36 units.

And I explained to him that one was his, the other by Father Messias and the 34 were intended for seminarians. He surprised me and invited me to see them and talk about work and the present. On occasion, I met another priest who was very kind to me.

At the exit, I delivered 12 more hearts: 03 parcels with 04 units, each for a lady and two girls who were in the convent. They liked the gift. Third stop: Jota Raposo Stadium, vaccination site.

I gave 15 units to the receptionist, explained the campaign and asked her to share with the professionals present and that these hearts represented my gratitude for the work they were doing to fight the epidemic.

On my way out of the stadium, I approached a young military police couple, introduced myself, talked about the project, and introduced them to 8 other units. We chatted quickly and it was a very pleasant conversation.

Finally, I went to the Ministry of Health to deliver packets of hearts to the Secretary of Health, who was not there, and neither his secretary nor the third person who could help me informed me that he was busy. Well, I took a paper, wrote to the secretary to explain, and left 39 units.

I was very happy with these meetings and these disagreements, because I believe that you only find the person you have to find; and even the one we haven't found will have the opportunity to see each other in the future.

And it is in these small gestures that we learn to live with the diversity of human beings with their knowledge and their feelings.
