Mr. Ilham Aliyev, President of the Republic of Azerbaijan and in cooperation with UNESCO, the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations, the United Nations World Tourism Organization, the Council of Europe, ISESCO and the North-South Centre of the Council of Europe.

The SPAC, aware of this plural identity unfortunately in the process of disappearing, wishes to contribute effectively with all the good wills wishing to work for development through poetry and literature. In Africa, young people are among the largest fringe of the population, however this youth has very little or no interest in literature in general and poetry in particular, partly due to the lack of frameworks to express themselves.

There are of course rudimentary football pitches! It is to get them interested in literature and specifically in poetry, to bring them closer to this other reality that humanizes man that SPAC is investing in creating or even merging synergies of action to set up platforms for sharing, exchanges and meetings.

In addition, the school population constitutes an important breeding ground in which the rooting of a literary and poetic culture can strengthen National Education, because poetry is a vector of positive values and contributes to strengthening ties, and to maintaining the torch of peace in these very troubled times, particularly in Africa.

By observing carefully around us, we realized that some continents have been able not only to create an environment favorable to developing the spirit of creativity, initiative, responsibility, awakening among their populations but also to spread a real culture of the book.

The "House of Poetry in Cameroon" project will therefore offer a space for intergenerational meetings, encouragement and promotion of talents.

In 1983, he wrote two songs for KKS Lech on the occasion of the double crown of the Polish champion and the winner of the Polish Super Cup. "To the heart" and "Hey Rail wayorz".

These works were performed during a break in the match at the Stadium at ul. Bulgarian in Poznan by the military unit complex in Biedrusek under the direction of Mr. Paweo Lomiski. He is also the initiator of cultural events in the country and abroad.

His important initiatives are the International Festival of Composers and Authors 60 and Over with the Silver Pegasus Laureal in Poznan and meetings with culture and art in the family alloy gardens. Since then, he has held some of the highest positions in the Health sectors in numerous countries, including Argentina and Israel. During these busy years he found that time to express his soul in poetry and the arts.

In this month's spotlight we seek inspirational words from the man we so admire. "Personally, as a professor of medicine and a poet, I believe that all doctors must be humanists and promote humanism and peace," says Khan. "We must love deeply and generously all of mankind.
