Good news.

The Peace Days initiative in Pernambuco has begun to bear fruit. I launched it on September 21, 2024, the International Day of Peace. And I'm working to raise awareness in 171 of the 184 cities in my state of Pernambuco.

From December 2024 to March 2025, three cities have established their own Municipal Peace Days through legislation. From 2000 to 2023, 13 cities have established their own Peace Days, with Igarassu being the first to do so. I participated in this coordination between 1999 and 2000, as a civilian in a peace project.

Six other cities are discussing the theme of peace, and I expect that by May, they will have formalized their Peace Days.

It's very important for a city to have a Peace Day because it's a milestone, the beginning of a collective effort to build peace.

When these seven cities have finalized the process of creating a Peace Day, I will summarize it for our newspaper. In addition to these cities, seven other municipal councils have expressed interest in creating one. With these results, we will have more strength to continue this action, which will last until September 21, 2026. This is a task that requires a great deal of patience and dialogue, because each city is a universe and each city has its own time.

I have been a city councilor and a member of the Poznań City Council for the Elderly for a year, which is a great honor for me. However, my soul as a social activist and ambassador of peace does not allow me to rest on my laurels. I have decided to create a global prize, the SAPS POLSKA "Nobel Citizen's Prize," intended to recognize all those who create culture and art, as well as those who consume and support them.

This "Nobel Citizen's Prize" is neither political nor religious, but entirely civic, awarded to those who strive for equality and peace among the nations of the world. I have addressed an appropriate request to those involved in pro-social movements, organizations, and associations to define the appropriate procedural rules, obtain media and, if necessary, financial support, and establish a partnership for action and reflection on the future of the world!

I have observed that the major awards are primarily awarded by politicians affiliated with religious groups and do not reward highly talented citizens of this world, nor their commitment to culture, art, world peace, and the lives of people, especially the elderly, the sick, and often the socially excluded and their families.

The award will cover the following areas: civic initiatives, works by composers, poets, and writers, art and culture, and the instigators of cultural events.

Today, I would like to present its appearance according to my own idea. After the jury's decision, the list of first prize winners will be announced. They have been awarded, first and foremost, to individuals and artists committed to world peace.

460 MILLION CHILDREN ARE LIVING IN
CONFLICT-AFFECTED AREAS
No Sport, No Peace!

These four words carry a powerful truth: without sport, we lose one of the most effective tools for peace.

This may sound provocative, but it is meant to spark reflection. In a world where over 460 million children live in conflict-affected areas, we cannot afford to overlook any means of action. While sport alone cannot end wars or resolve deep-seated conflicts, it plays a critical role in preventing violence and fostering reconciliation. And these are key elements to build - and live in - peaceful communities.

Sport is a universal language that transcends borders, politics, and ideologies, uniting people in ways few other activities can. Around the world, sport has bridged divides where politics and diplomacy have struggled. It has brought together nations once at war, healed communities torn by conflict, and given young people an alternative to violence.

In every game, match, or competition, we witness the values that sustain peace: respect, teamwork, fairness, and mutual understanding. Sport teaches us that our differences do not have to divide us; rather, they can enrich our collective strength. Because sport is built around rules that apply equally to everyone.

Through the equity of sport, we can prevent violence and conflict in all its forms, including online. When we play together, we break down barriers: ethnic, social or religious. When we compete with integrity, we promote justice and fairness in society.

Yet, in many places, sport is overlooked as tool for education, violence prevention and reconciliation. It may not be a life-saving necessity like food, water, or shelter, but it is a cost-effective tool. It is a universal language that, if used by trained educators with the intention to achieve social objectives, can transmit knowledge and skills that enhance self-confidence, promote mutual understanding, cooperation, and respect.

On this International Day of Sport for Development and Peace, we reaffirm with conviction that sport is far more than entertainment or competition: it is a powerful catalyst for peace.

We encourage the international community to join us in this call, and raise a #WhiteCard for the 460 million children whose lives are disrupted by conflict.

Without sport, we risk losing one of our greatest avenues for peace. Together, let's ensure that sport's potential isn't overlooked but fully embraced.

Because where there is sport, there is peace.

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I am sending you this email to inform you about the initiative: Pernambuco Peace Days, a process of liaison with the 184 council chambers of my state, Pernambuco. After eight months of activity, here are the results obtained so far. The 13 cities in dark green are those that created their municipal peace days between 2000 and 2023.

The seven cities in light green are those that created their municipal peace days between December 2024 and April 2025, resulting from the coordination mentioned above. The seven cities in orange are already voting or awaiting approval from the city council.

As this is a simple project, I believe everything will be finalized by June. The 23 cities in yellow have confirmed receipt of the letter and are currently evaluating it legally in order to present it at the meeting with the councilors.

The 134 cities in light blue are those I will have to organize in the future. Today, I am working with 50 city halls, which is very significant for an initiative that is only eight months old. Working with this universe, in this case 171 city halls, is a wonderful and transformative experience, but patience is the surest way to dialogue and strengthen the proposal, because each city has its own pace and its own vision of peace.

Julián Ramírez García Colombia / Costa Rica / Poland

Director of the Unamos Culturas Foundation, visual artist, professor of international relations and political science, and promoter of nonviolence as an ethical, political, and aesthetic principle. For more than fifteen years, I have dedicated my life to building bridges between peoples, memories, and imaginations through art, critical education, social justice, and intercultural research.

Through my artistic and academic work, I seek to make visible the silent voices of the indigenous peoples of Latin America, defending their knowledge as the spiritual and political heritage of humanity.

My work revolves around the themes of exile, memory, dignity, and reconciliation, addressing the concept of the "monopoly of pain," which denounces the way in which certain narratives of human suffering are prioritized and exclude others, thus perpetuating new forms of violence.

I have had the privilege of giving lectures, workshops, and courses at various universities and cultural centers in Europe and Latin America on topics such as the history of peace processes, nonviolence as a path to political transformation, art as a vehicle for memory, and transitional justice in post-conflict contexts.

These institutions include the University of Granada, the University of Łódź, the Universidad Técnica Particular de Loja (UTPL), the CAPAZ Institute (Germany), the University of Giessen, and numerous community spaces and museums committed to intercultural dialogue.

In 2024, I organized the Łódź Peace Forum in Poland, with the participation of more than twenty countries.

I am currently coordinating the 2nd International Peace Forum – Granada 2025 (October 20-25) and the International Symposium on Peace Research (October 28-30), two complementary spaces that seek to articulate academic, community, and artistic voices around the construction of a comprehensive, dignified, and transformative peace.

It would be a true honor for me to count on the support of the Universal Circle of Ambassadors for Peace in this initiative.

Your presence, your words, and your energy would be invaluable in strengthening the ethical and universal message of the Forum. The doors are open to your symbolic, institutional, or testimonial participation. My vocation is not only to speak about peace, but to embody it in daily practices, in artistic gestures, and in actively listening to others. I believe in a peace with a human face, built from the bottom up, woven across differences, and sustained by the dignity of all memories.

I humbly and gratefully accept this appointment as Ambassador for Peace, which I consider an ethical commitment to those who have been excluded from history and who continue to struggle to be heard. May this circle that brings us together be a shared flame amidst the shadows.
