My mission is to continue working for peace through my writing, to share my poetry with others to raise awareness about this issue, and to be a model of pacifism in my daily life—civic, personal, professional, and community-based. This honorary title is not just a distinction, but a moral responsibility. For me, it means being exemplary not only in my behavior toward human beings, but also toward animals and plants. This might seem exaggerated, even ridiculous, to some who believe that the human species is superior to the rest of living beings, but that is not my view. All beings deserve respect and peace, for the life they carry is sacred.

Finally, to answer the question of whether poetry can change anything in a world rife with violence, I would remind you that Plato excluded poets from his ideal city, because there is no place for poetry in a perfect world. Thus, in a world torn apart by wars, poets must embody the voice of wisdom, which, in the darkness, guides humanity's steps toward the light.

In this regard, I would like to quote Andrée Chédeville: "Faced with the bankruptcy of beliefs and the dearth of hope, poetry is urgently needed. It offers no solace. It possesses nothing; its law is not set in stone."

But by taking up and giving voice, it multiplies our lives." And Cioran: "Poets are useless, but indispensable." The poet must be the voice of the oppressed and the marginalized, of those who cannot speak out in their own defense. Writing poetry is an act of resistance and solidarity.

OBJECTIVE:

To encourage reflection on peace and sustainable development through personal expression, highlighting everyone's role as an agent of change in building a better world. To use art and technology as tools for connection and expression, promoting a sense of community, empathy, and environmental commitment.

This activity aims to help participants become aware of their ability to contribute to a sustainable future, where peace and environmental protection are fundamental pillars. - Sheets of paper with the "Selfie for Peace" logo as a frame. - Drawing materials: pencils, markers, and colored pencils. - Technological tools: tablets or phones for taking selfies and/or photos. - A dedicated space for displaying drawings, selfies, and/or photos.

STARTING OBJECTIVE MATERIALS

Introduction to the Selfie Activity: Invite participants to take a Selfie with their drawing or photo, individually or in groups. Images can be shared on social media with the hashtag #SelfieforPeace.

Exhibition:

Create a mural or collage with your drawings, selfies, photos, travel journals, and other materials, highlighting the diversity of perspectives on peace and commitment to a sustainable future.

REFLECTION PHRASE:

Conclude with a discussion on the lessons learned and their application to daily life, integrating sustainable practices and responsible use of technology. This space should foster human interaction, emphasizing empathy and respect in our relationships. Closing activity.

GROUP REFLECTION: Technology will be used responsibly to disseminate, share, and learn together.

RESPONSIBLE TECHNOLOGY: Invite each participant to reflect on their role as an agent of change in their environment, emphasizing the idea that every individual action has a collective impact. Central concept:

Educating for Peace.

Educating for peace involves cultivating values such as solidarity, respect, and empathy, raising awareness of individuals' impact on the world, and motivating them to act with responsibility and compassion. Peace and sustainable development are thus presented as complementary paths toward a possible and shared future. This activity invites us to consider peace from everyone's perspective, uniting art, reflection, and action.

Mission and vision: To promote a culture of peace that fosters coexistence, respect for human dignity, and the peaceful resolution of conflicts. To encourage dialogue, empathy, and cooperation among individuals, communities, and nations, integrating education and technology as tools for human development, inclusion, and building a more just and equitable world.

Our Peace Ambassador, Edmario Jobat from the city of Igarassu, Pernambuco, Brazil, organized the 7th Igarassu Peace Hug on May 21, 2025, Igarassu Municipal Peace Day, a date established by law on March 20, 2000.

This activity is part of the Hands Promoting Peace project, created in 2018 by Edmario and organized in partnership with civil society organizations, schools, and public authorities. Since the first edition in 2019, the hug has taken place in the city's historic center, specifically on a lawn in a beautiful setting surrounded by nature and very old buildings, as Igarassu was founded in 1535. However, people located outside of Igarassu or with travel, health, or work-related issues could participate remotely by posting a Selfie on social media. In 2020, due to the pandemic, the embrace took place on social media, officially making the event a hybrid, as people from other countries participated. The idea was to bring the experience of the embrace to all corners of the globe. This format was a success; people from Peru, Senegal, Kenya, and other regions of Brazil have already participated remotely. In 2019, we had 350 participants; in 2024, 4,282; and in 2025, 3,381 participants from Brazil and Peru. There were 26 organizations involved: 11 Brazilian schools and 2 Peruvian schools. The activity is being improved and adapted to ensure that the experience of the embrace of peace is accessible to everyone. However, previous hugs have taken place, and the second edition of the hug was held in the coastal district of Nova Cruz and also in the rural district of Três Ladeiras.

In fact, the final act of this activity is the ceremony of the 24 petals of the Flower of Peace, during which 24 young people form a circle, each with a fruit plant, and in the center of the circle, a young woman raises a small globe representing the Earth with the following message: All hearts.

All prayers. All actions. All colors for peace and the planet. The event took place at the premises of a local NGO partnered with Abraço. Climate change has affected our habits.

At Holy Land Trust, we believe that every child and young person has the right to feel safe, seen, and supported. This summer, our work focuses on building resilience and providing healing spaces for children and youth facing daily stress and uncertainty.

We are excited to announce that we have already started our Art Therapy Summer Camp in partnership with Inad Theatre, bringing together 35 children, including 10 children from Shurouq School for Blind Children. Through expressive arts and music, this initiative is part of our commitment to creating inclusive spaces where children with disabilities can integrate and build meaningful connections with other children in the wider community, fostering empathy, connection, and mutual respect.

The camp runs from July 14 to July 25, offering a variety of engaging activities designed to promote creativity, cooperation, and self-expression.

Meanwhile, from July 21st to July 28th, Holy Land Trust is partnering with the Salesian Scout Summer Camp, working with 45 teenagers aged 15–18. Our team will lead four transformative trainings rooted in our core philosophy of trauma-informed nonviolence:

Nonlinear Leadership

Youth Leadership Skills

Trauma-Informed Care

Conflict Resolution

These interactive workshops aim to strengthen emotional intelligence, build community trust, and develop the inner leadership potential of the next generation.

Both programs reflect our deep commitment to helping young people transform trauma into hope, and to equipping them with tools for resilience, compassion, and leadership.

In addition to the trainings, HLT will also contribute to entertainment activities designed to foster joy and collective energy for the entire camp.
